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- Opened in 2004
- African owned and African led
- Independent entity at Makerere University
- >50% self-supporting
- 17,000 patients in clinic
  - Most are women
  - ~40% on HAART
  - <\$1/day in earnings
- Has emerged as major referral site and Center of Excellence in East Africa

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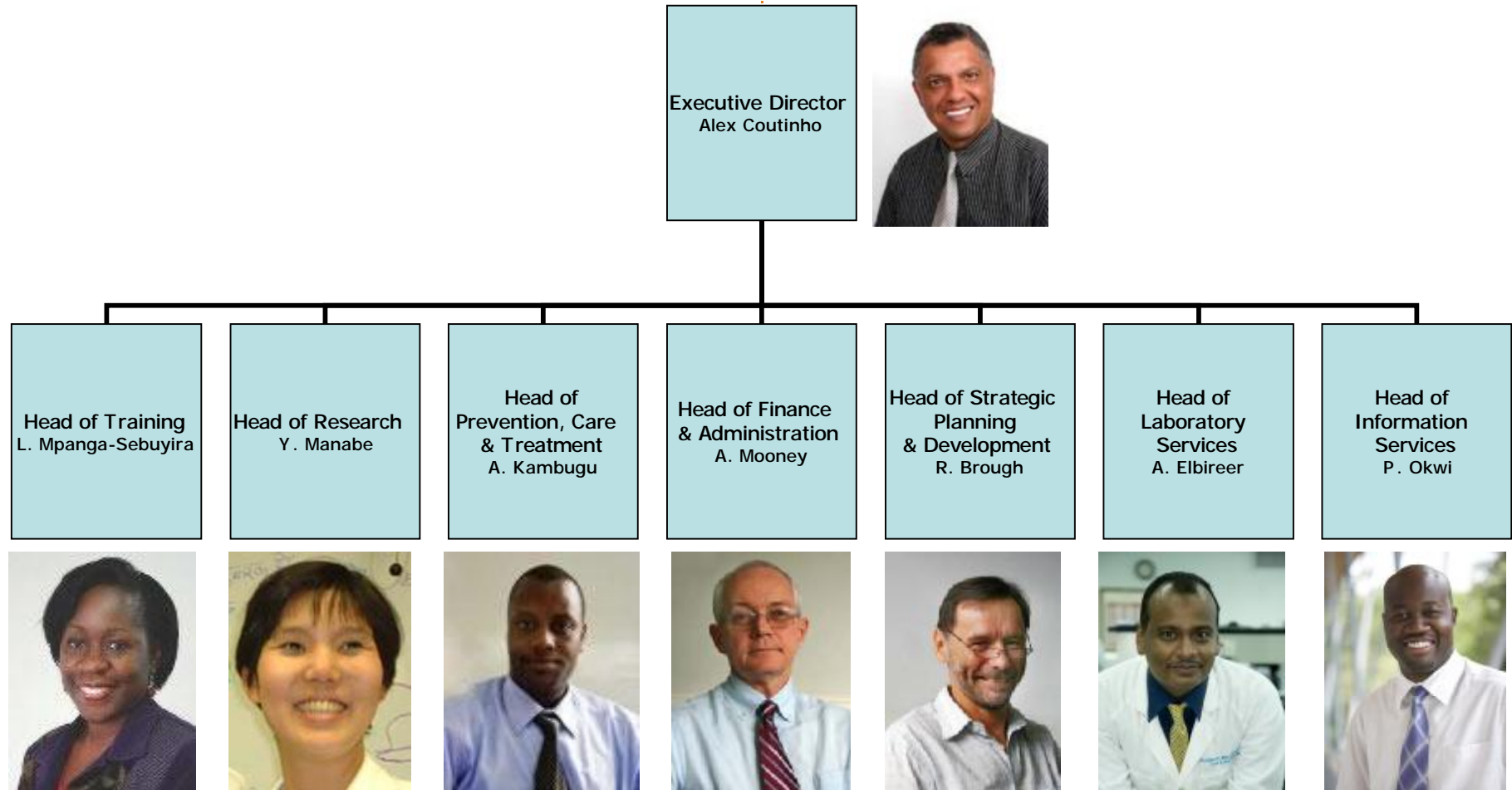

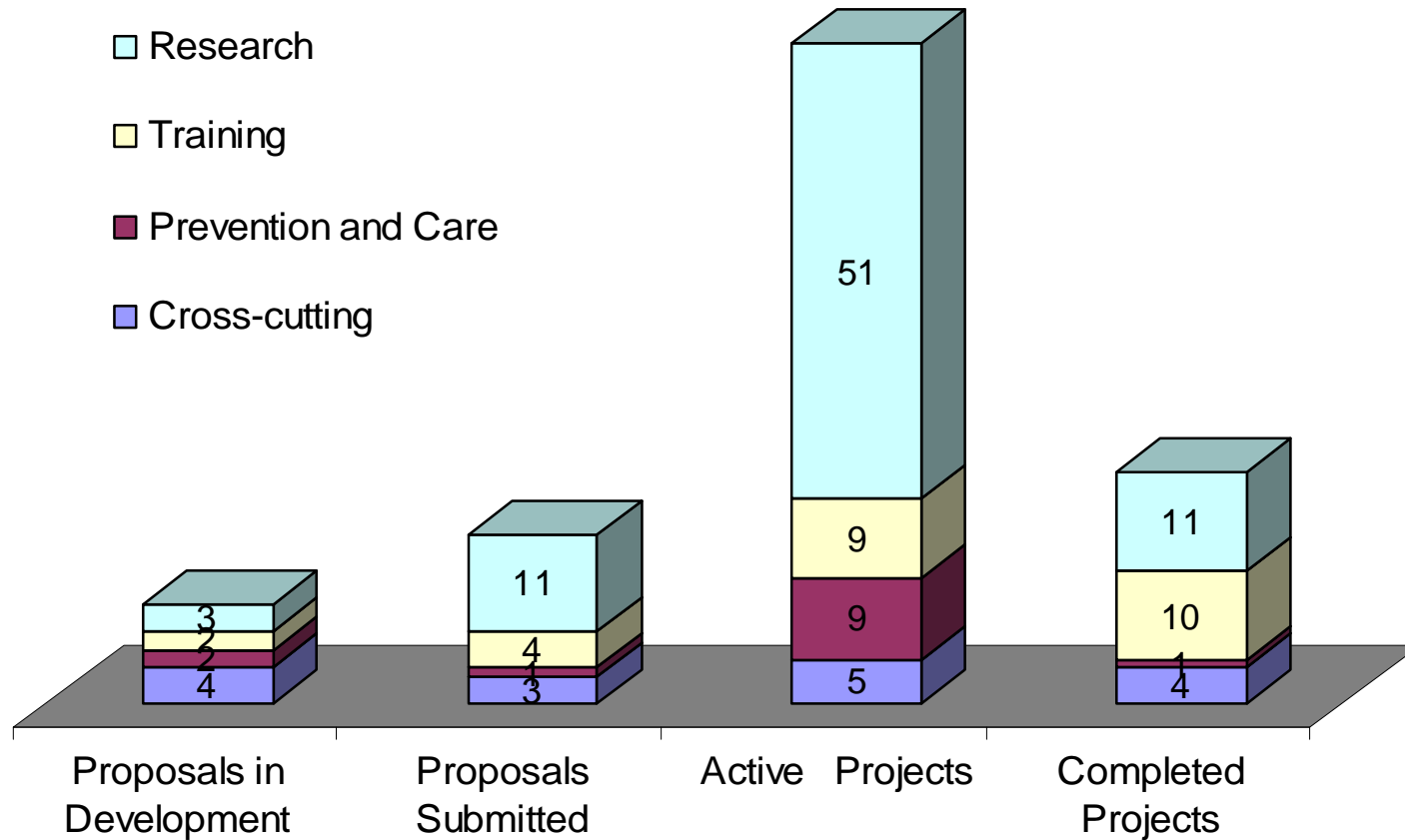
